3 Things to Do

- 1. Write a list of things you should do to help your children reach their God given aspiration and dreams.



As you learn God's plan for your child's life, implement the three primes. The Prime Directive – Give your child a good start. The Prime Objective – Nurture your child in ways of the Lord. The Prime Result – Recognize that your child is fearfully and wonderfully made, so follow the Creator's instructions.

The Fundamental Question Who has the Lord sent us to train?

- I. We have wonderful children. I have the same conversation with them, all the time. Why? The Fundamental Question and the Three Primes.
