3 Things to Do



- I. John Wesley did not just preach and organize congregations. He organized ministries to help the poor and underprivileged.
- II. John Wesley preached, "Gain all you can, save all you can, and give all you can." {The Use of Money 1760}
- III. Without faith it is impossible to please God, but without love it is impossible to obey him.
- IV. Our love must go beyond ourselves and our own tables.

- V. We serve a Compassionate God; therefore we must be compassionate people.
- VI. Can we look past our own hurt and see the pain of others? (The parable of the unmerciful servant - Matthew 17:21-35)

VII. Let's see our brother or sister in need and have compassion. Let our kindness extend beyond the Thanksgiving to Christmas Season and continue throughout the year.
